


#### **Scorecard for Accountability and Action**

### Malaria

#### **Progress**

Côte d'Ivoire has successfully raised resources for the financing of the required number of LLINs, RDTs, and ACTs in 2017 and has procured enough LLINs to achieve universal coverage of LLINs in 2017. The country has also scaled up implementation of iCCM and achieved operational universal coverage of LLINs. Côte d'Ivoire has significantly enhanced the tracking and accountability mechanisms for malaria with the development of a Malaria Control and Elimination Scorecard.

#### **Impact**

The annual reported number of malaria cases in 2015 was 3,606,725 with 2,604 deaths. WHO estimates that the country has achieved a decrease of 20-40% in the malaria incidence rate and a decrease of greater than 40% in the malaria mortality rate for the period 2010 - 2015.

#### Key Challenge

Securing longer term resources for malaria programming.

#### **Previous Key Recommended Action**

Côte d'Ivoire has responded positively to the recommended action on the monitoring of national insecticide resistance.

## **MNCH**

## **Progress**

The country has made progress on tracer MNCH interventions, with high coverage of vitamin A and has recently increased coverage of DPT3 and ARTs in the total population. Côte d'Ivoire has significantly enhanced the tracking and accountability mechanisms with the development of a Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child and Adolescent Health Scorecard.

## **Previous Key Recommended Actions**

Côte d'Ivoire has responded positively to the MNCH recommended action addressing low coverage of exclusive breastfeeding and accelerating coverage of ARTs in children and continues to track progress as this action is implemented.
