

Côte d'Ivoire ALMA Quarterly Report Quarter One, 2018



Scorecard for Accountability and Action





Malaria transmission occurs all year round throughout Côte d'Ivoire, although it is more seasonal in the north of the country. The annual reported number of malaria cases in 2016 was 3,471,024 with 3,340 deaths.

Progress

Côte d'Ivoire has successfully raised resources for the financing of the required number of LLINs, RDTs, and ACTs in 2018 and has procured enough LLINs to achieve universal operational coverage of LLINs. The country has also scaled up implementation of iCCM, Côte d'Ivoire has significantly enhanced the tracking and accountability mechanisms for malaria with the development of a Malaria Control and Elimination Scorecard.

Impact

The annual reported number of malaria cases in 2016 was 3,471,024 with 3,340 deaths.

Key Challenge

Securing longer term resources for malaria programming.

Previous Key Recommended Action

Côte d'Ivoire has responded positively to the recommended action on the monitoring of national insecticide resistance.

MNCH and NTDs

Progress

The country has made progress on the tracer MNCH intervention of postnatal care, and has recently increased coverage of ARTs in the total population. Côte d'Ivoire has significantly enhanced the tracking and accountability mechanisms with the development of a Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child and Adolescent Health Scorecard.

Progress in addressing Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs) in Côte d'Ivoire is measured using a composite index calculated from preventive chemotherapy coverage achieved for onchocerciasis, schistosomiasis, soil transmitted helminths, and trachoma. Preventive chemotherapy coverage in Côte d'Ivoire is high for onchocerciasis (95%), schistosomiasis (84%) and soil transmitted helminths (85%). Coverage for trachoma is 32%. Overall, the NTD preventive chemotherapy coverage index for Côte d'Ivoire in 2016 is 68 and this represents a substantial increase compared with the 2015 index value (11).
