

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

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Malaria

Progress

Senegal has implemented iCCM country wide. The country has carried out insecticide resistance monitoring since 2014 and has reported the results to WHO. Senegal has secured sufficient resources to sustain universal coverage of essential malaria control interventions in 2017 and has achieved universal operational coverage of LLINs. Senegal has significantly enhanced the tracking and accountability mechanisms for malaria with the development of a Malaria Control and Elimination Scorecard. Senegal has put in place strong public sector management systems and has achieved a rating of 3.6 for Cluster D CPIA.

Impact

The annual reported number of malaria cases in 2015 was 502,084 with 536 deaths. WHO estimates that the country has achieved a decrease of 20-40% in the malaria incidence rate and a change of less than 20% for malaria mortality rate for the period 2010 - 2015.

Senegal has achieved high coverage of the tracer MNCH intervention vitamin A and DPT3 and has recently increased coverage of ARTs in the total population. The country has significantly enhanced the tracking and accountability mechanisms with the development of the Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child and Adolescent Health Scorecard.
