

Malaria

The Global Fund

The Global Fund has announced that Cote d'Ivoire will receive € 189.6 million for HIV, tuberculosis, malaria, and health systems strengthening as the country allocation for 2018-2020. The Global Fund has determined the total allocation amount based on Cote d'Ivoire's disease burden and income level, as well as several other factors. The malaria component is also allocated a specific proportion of the total, according to a formula developed by the Global Fund that takes into account several factors, including disease burden and previous disbursements. For Cote d'Ivoire this is calculated at € 111.1 million. The allocations to the individual disease components are not fixed, and can be adjusted according to decisions made at country level. Cote d'Ivoire is urged to ensure that resources are allocated to malaria control from the overall Global Fund country allocation, as well as from domestic resources, to sustain the gains made in recent years.

Progress

Côte d'Ivoire has successfully raised resources for the financing of the required number of LLINs, RDTs, and ACTs in 2016 and has procured enough LLINs to achieve universal coverage of LLINs in 2016. The country has also scaled up implementation of iCCM.

Impact

The annual reported number of malaria cases in 2015 was 3,606,725 with 2,604 deaths. WHO estimates that the country has achieved a decrease of 20-40% in the malaria incidence rate and a decrease of greater than 40% in the malaria mortality rate for the period 2010 - 2015.

Key Challenge

Securing longer term resources for malaria programming.

Progress

The country has made progress on tracer MNCH interventions, with high coverage of vitamin A.

Previous Key Recommended Actions

Côte d'Ivoire has responded positively to the MNCH recommended action addressing low coverage of exclusive breastfeeding, accelerating coverage of ARTs and continues to track progress as this action is implemented.
