To spur accelerated action towards malaria elimination in Africa, the Continental Scorecard for Accountability and Action, coupled with national malaria scorecards and action trackers are critical tools in identifying key bottlenecks for sustained malaria action, advocacy, resource mobilization and promotion of accountability."




